

1. What is the Zenex Foundation Literacy Project?

The Zenex Foundation Literacy Project is an innovative teacher development intervention to assist teachers in the Foundation Phase with Home Language (HL) and First Additional Language (FAL) literacy teaching, aligned with the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements (CAPS).

The Literacy Project is to be implemented in one district in KwaZulu-Natal, Eastern Cape and Western Cape. These three provinces provide the opportunity to work in three different language contexts, and in an urban and rural setting.


2. Why a Literacy Project?

- National and international assessments of literacy levels tell us our learners are not performing at the required grade levels.
- Research tells us that there is a critical relationship between children's acquisition of language in their early years and their ability to learn.
- Children need a strong foundation in their mother tongue to support the introduction of a second language.
- Low literacy levels are linked to learners' socio-economic background, including a language and print-rich home context.

Who is the Zenex Foundation?
